1. Capture nature's beauty! Create artwork that showcases the ocean's beauty and/or living things in the ocean
2. Think local! Create artwork from an ocean-related photo you've taken here in San Diego
3. Artwork with a message! Create artwork that explores and addresses the importance of ocean conservation and/or a brings attention to a specific current issue that negatively impacts on our oceans)
